The Zambia Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (Z-EITI) is pleased to announce an open call for civil society representatives to participate in the upcoming elections for the EITI Multi-Stakeholder Group (MSG).

Who Can Participate?

All members of civil society organizations, community-based groups, and faith-based organisations, workers and student representatives who demonstrate expertise in natural resource governance and a commitment to the principles of EITI are invited to apply. Women Rights Organisations are particularly encouraged to apply.

About the MSG

The MSG is composed of representatives from government, industry, and civil society (CS), and plays a crucial role in overseeing the implementation of EITI standards at the national level.
